The importance of the four days of prayer leading up to September 20 is to reinforce that giving is part of our discipleship. Even if you can't join us at one of the venues, I hope you wold be able to join us in prayer at home or in your parish. As someone once said, "prayer moves the hand that moves the world." As we face the effects of this crisis together, it can also move our hearts to sacrificial generosity and love.

I so look forward to meeting many of you in the coming weeks.

MAKING A FACE MASK

This is a simple guide to making a face covering. A cloth face covering should cover your mouth and nose while allowing you to breathe comfortably. More information on <u>using face coverings</u> during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is available.

To make a simple face covering You will need:

- two or three 25cm x 25cm squares of cotton fabric
- two 20cm pieces of elastic (or string or cloth strips)
- needle and thread
- scissors

Items you need for a sewn cloth face covering



Step 1: Cut out 25cm x 25cm squares of cotton fabric. Stack the squares on top of each other.

Step 2: Fold over one side by 0.75cm and hem, then repeat on the opposite side. Make 2 channels by folding the double layer of fabric over 1.5cm along each side and stitching this down.

Step 3: Run a 20cm length of elastic (or string or cloth strip) through the wider hem on each side of the face covering. These will be the ear loops. Use a large needle to thread it through. Tie the ends tightly.



Step 4: Gently pull on the elastic so that the knots are tucked inside the hem. Gather the sides of the covering on the elastic and adjust so the covering fits your face. Then securely stitch the elastic in place to keep it from slipping. These elastic loops fit over the ears.



Face coverings should not be used by children under the age of 3 or those who may find it difficult to manage them correctly. For example, primary age children unassisted, or those with respiratory conditions.

Always take care to use equipment safely to avoid injury. Children should only follow these instructions under the supervision of adult

CLERGY THOUGHTS BY CLIVE

I see that the last time I contributed to "Clergy thoughts" was in February, the last month in which we had anything remotely like normality. Since then life has not been the same for any of us. We have had to restrict our activities to protect ourselves and others from the virus. We have been learning to wear masks, more for the protection of others than for ourselves. We have taken a step back to childhood in being reminded to wash our hands and being shown recommended ways in which to do it, ranging from the advice to sing "God save the Queen" once or "Happy Birthday" twice to ensure that we take long enough over it, to demonstration videos by various people all over the world. Two of my favourites have been the Mayor of Tokyo's handwashing technique and the Japanese pop group Arashi's demonstration video, complete with specially written song. Many of us have so far managed to avoid the virus, while others have caught it and recovered, but perhaps some of us have lost someone we know through it. Slowly some aspects of normality have started to reappear, but the threat remains and we still have a long way to go.

For me recent months have to some extent brought me back to an old normality. As a former IT professional, the task of editing on-line services has brought me back to the strangely familiar world of sitting in front of a computer for hours, as well as to the familiar frustration of finding work-arounds for software bugs that I'm not in a position to fix myself.

The familiar, whether it's something familiar from an earlier period in our lives, or the familiar routines of only a few months ago before everybody was concerned about the virus, can give us a sense of security. It can also be a prison. The Israelites had scarcely escaped from Egypt before they started yearning for the old normality: "If only we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, where we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into the wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger" (Exodus 16:3). The old normality is viewed through rose-tinted glasses; the old experience of slavery and oppression is viewed as a time of fleshpots, as security in contrast to the apparent uncertainties of following God's lead out of Egypt towards the Promised Land.

Perhaps the interruption of normality is a useful reminder that the old familiarities, whatever they are, cannot last, that "here we have no lasting city, but we are looking for the city that is to come" (Hebrews 13:14), that, like the heroes of faith in Hebrews 11, we are "strangers and foreigners on the earth" (Hebrews 11:13). We shouldn't seek for security in things that pass away, in things we can't keep, in circumstances that change through circumstances that we can't control. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever" (Hebrews 13:8). Let's seek our security in the right place.
