May is a month of transition. At the beginning, we can feel like we're still in winter, with frosts and rain. By the end, summer feels just around the corner with longer evenings and warmer days. Our lives are still governed by these rhythms even though many of us no longer have the farming connections we once did. Our ancestors were much more bound by the clock and the seasons. The calendar and liturgical years were intertwined; the church was more central to people's lives.

Ecclesiastes contains that well known passage about times and seasons, a time to plant and a time to harvest; a time to mourn and a time to laugh; a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing. This year, our diocesan family is focusing firmly on celebration. I have always thought that the continued existence of the church is one of the surest proofs of the resurrection. How could an organisation composed of frail, sinful people like you and me still be here but for divine intervention?

No other human organisation has continued in this way. The world was vastly different 1350 years ago when Putta made the gruelling journey here from Rochester to become our first Bishop. England didn't exist. Our diocese was carved out of the corner of a Mercian kingdom and part of an old Roman settlement. Over the course of our existence, kings have risen and fallen; cathedrals have been burnt down and rebuilt, fallen and been rebuilt again!

Previous Bishops, in a variety of acts of architectural vandalism, have used their own (or their wealthy wife's) money to remodel the Palace and even demolish bits of it they didn't like. Meanwhile, in over 400 churches, faithful Christian people have gone about the work of the gospel. Priests have hatched, matched and dispatched, celebrated the sacraments and taught the faith. We have made the transition from Catholic to protestant; from Christendom to being a minority in a largely secular, indifferent and occasionally hostile culture. We have both remained faithful to the tradition and found ways to proclaim the faith afresh to each generation. There have been times of relative ease and times of real struggle. Churches have fallen down and been rebuilt, and populations have shifted.

All this has happened in the power of the Holy Spirit, whose gift we will celebrate at the end of this month. We have never had to do it on our own, dependent on our own ingenuity. To be a Christian is to be supernaturally empowered by the Holy Spirit. God's faithfulness and that power are definitely worth celebrating.

Clergy Thoughts

“The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me ... to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favour.” (Luke 4:18-19)

Apparently, the fifth month, May, is the month of Grace. I have been unable to find out why it is so designated, or by whom, and whether other months have their own attributes – perhaps someone out there can enlighten me – but I would like to think that all months are months of grace, that indeed we live our whole lives in God’s grace, his undeserved favour towards us. For, without his grace, we would all still be in thrall to sin. Instead, we can look forward to the coming of the Kingdom of God when grace and mercy will abound.

And the church has picked up on that theme for the period between Ascension and Pentecost, this year 14th-24th May. In recent years, since 2016 in fact so just 10 years, this period has been devoted to a global ecumenical prayer movement called *Thy Kingdom Come*. (TKC) The Church of England promotes it and always puts out accompanying literature. (This can be obtained from Church Publishing and Outreach. cpo.org.uk.) But this is not just a CE thing. It has become a worldwide project which unites a million Christians worldwide, in nearly 90% of the countries of the world and across 85 denominations. We are all invited to join them to pray particularly during this period that more people will come to know Jesus – that the Kingdom may indeed grow. This is from the CE website:

It is our hope and prayer, that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and His love for the world, will hear it for themselves and respond and follow Him.



Specifically, we again invite each and every Christian across the globe to pray that God’s Spirit might work in the lives of five people who have not responded with their ‘Yes’ to God’s call.

It's a good idea to note down the names of five people you have chosen to pray for so that you can remember them each day.

This year, the subtitle for TKC, if you like, is *God With Us*. There is a Prayer Journal available, and also a booklet suggesting ways your church can join in. But on a personal level, there is a Novena, a programme for nine consecutive days of prayer, simply called *God With Us*. And this year, it has been written by our very new Archbishop of Canterbury, Sarah Mullally and contains ideas for your own prayers over the period. Archbishop Sarah admits that we often feel powerless to change the world, especially in these recent weeks of escalating conflict, but we still know that the Spirit is at work in the world. And our prayer must be that he will continue to work and bring the Kingdom into being. This is an opportunity for us all to join in his work, so that the people that we have chosen to pray for, and indeed many others around the world, this Ascensiontide, will come to know for themselves that God is indeed with us.

My path crossed with Mary's when we formed the group 'Friends of St Calixtus.' initially a fundraising group set up to host a flower festival. Mary (never one to oversell herself) came saying I can't arrange flowers but I can sell raffle tickets! This she had been in charge of at the gardening club in village hall. So, Mary sold raffle tickets, then we discovered her baking skills and Mary's coffee cake was legendary. The first cake to go on every bake sale and open garden teas.

Happy to be in the kitchen at parties and other fundraising events, Mary would be chief pot washer ! Her enthusiasm and sense of humour was a joy. For 10 years we baked, washed up, flogged raffle tickets and cajoled people into joining us, and individually those things seem small. But because of Mary you are sitting on comfy cushions on the pews.

The church walls were decorated because of her efforts. The church Bell's were restored and rung for Mary.

Her love of history and ancestry research means we have books in church which contain the story of every person on our war memorial, they alone are not just a tribute to our war dead but a tribute to her. Please look at them sometime.

All the graves here at St Calixtus were plotted and their memorials listed because of the work Mary did with Tasley WI.

Mary was on the cleaning and flower rota for church and it was a joy to see her with visitors researching their family burial plots, she not only knew where to find the relative, she could tell them where the aunty lived or the grandad worked and if that wasn't enough she'd take their email and research it for them. Amazing.

After a bit of arm twisting Mary joined the Parochial church council, PCC. Within a couple of years she was treasurer and with her years of accounting knowledge behind her ,was a huge benefit to us keeping the books in perfect shape.

Mary loved a good funeral ! In latter years we had to deliver the order of service to her and explain in depth who was there and what the news was.

Only last month Mary reminded me (as she was planning on an August funeral) that her favourite funeral flowers were out of the garden, and atop the coffin a sheaf of wheat.

Well Mary I couldn't quite manage that but I found a few ears of wheat just for you.(On Mary's window, behind pulpit.)

Mary will always be in our hearts and within these walls.

Together as a family, look out of your window, or go for a nature hunt outside!

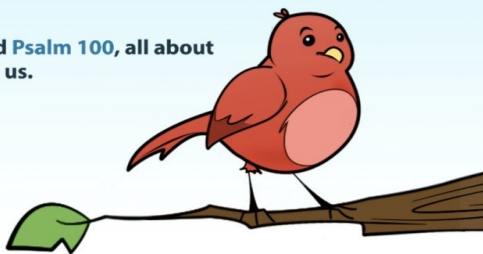
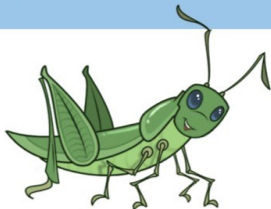
As you go through the activities, read **Psalm 100**, all about praising God for the life he has given us.

1. Listen for bird songs.

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs." v1-2

It's so good to sing, shout or whisper to tell God what we're thankful for and to be excited about his beautiful world.

- What do you think the birds are saying?
- Can you learn to identify a bird by its song?



2. Look up at the sky.

"Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his." v3

God is incredible. He made us in his image and we are all unique—just like the clouds!

- Notice the shapes of the clouds. What can you see?
- How does it make you feel to look up at the sky? What do you think God is saying?

3. Look for animal tracks, an animal in motion, or a bird in flight.

"We are his people, the sheep of his pasture." v3

God loves all of his creation so much and keeps watch over us.

- Can you identify which animals made the tracks? What is the animal doing?
- Can you make your own footprints in the ground?

4. Spot a bird's nest.

"Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise." v4

Follow a bird with your eyes and see if you can spot the bird's nest.

Nests are amazing! They are intricate and strong. Inside this cleverly woven creation of twigs, grass and moss, birds lay their eggs, which are bursting full of new life. They are a safe place for birds to raise their young.

- How is this nest like your home?
- What do you love about your home?
- What makes you feel safe?



5. Find something beautiful.

"Give thanks to him and praise his name." v4

Will you pray this prayer? *"Thank you Lord for all these wonderful signs of life, which remind us that you made us as part of your creation, and that Jesus came to bring new life to us all. Amen"*

- Can you photograph, draw or describe things that you are thankful for in creation?





6. Find a plant that looks dead.

"Give thanks to him and praise his name." v5

Now look and see if you can find some buds or new shoots.

Dead leaves and sticks are essential to life! They break down to make new soil.

- Talk about another example of when something dead becomes something new.
- God's love never ends. What's difficult for you now? Could you pray about it together as a family? Where do you see God's love in your life now?



8. Can you find any other signs of life?

- Water Butterflies Moss
- Blossoms Insects Bees

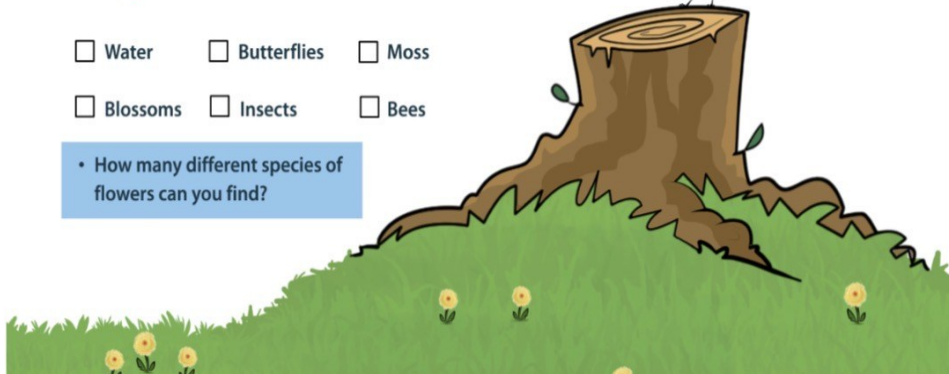
- How many different species of flowers can you find?

7. Look for a tree stump.

"His faithfulness continues through all generations." v5

The number of dark rings on a tree shows how old it is. They can keep growing for hundreds of years! And your family tree includes lots of great, great, great grandparents, aunts and uncles who lived a long time ago. God saw them all and took care of them too.

- Can you find a tree stump and count the rings?
- How many different species of leaves can you spot?
- Share some stories of where you've seen God's faithfulness in your family.
