## **Morville Parish Council**

**“Shropshire Council recently invited all parish and town councils to nominate someone who had made an outstanding contribution to the local community; Morville PC nominated Pam Yuille.**

**Pam was one of two winners and will attend a Buckingham Palace Garden Party in May. Congratulations to Pam and we look forward to seeing the photos.” (Jonathan Davey, Chairman MPC)**

Last December MPC voted to support The Acton’s planning applications for an extension and a farm shop. Shropshire Council has now granted planning permission for the extension but we have yet to hear about the farm shop.

At the PC Meeting on 9th February, Coll Macdonald presented speeding data from the first Morville SID and offered to obtain quotes for erecting a post for the second SID at the opposite end of the village. Councillors thanked him for all the time and effort that he is putting into this and unanimously voted to accept his offer. Details will be published in the Minutes of this meeting.

Pam Yuille has accepted an offer from Phil Mark, a Severn Trent Community Flooding Officer, to become the parish council representative of a group to identify local flooding issues and try and deliver Natural Flood Management [NFM] solutions.

An initial meeting on 5th February was also attended by James Lawrence, the National Trust’s Sandscape Project Officer, and one of the local landowners. ## Morville School News

Hello from the Morville school family.

Our whole school was rocking just before the end of term with our fantastic Rock Star Maths Day! The children had a wonderful time practising their number knowledge and demonstrating those key multiplication skills. This ended with a whole school parade and rock performance where the children performed some amazing counting and multiplication songs. This has quickly become an annual tradition at Morville and children are already planning activities for next year.

Our Year 1 and Year 2 had the wonderful opportunity to spend the day at St Laurence's Church in Ludlow bringing Bible stories to life. They had great fun acting out the story of Joseph and the journey of Moses. They showed lots of imagination and enthusiasm and it was wonderful to see them bring these stories to life. It was visible for all to see how the children's confidence grew as they worked together, took on different roles, and supported one another as they performed to other schools.

Although the wet weather has dampened some of the planned sporting events for this half term the school and children are already looking forward to several events after the half term break. These include fishing, a swimming gala and cross-country competitions.

**In Oak Tree class** this half term the children will be 'Off to Great Places' where they will explore the mysterious wonders of Shanghai as well as learn all about Chinese New Year and the many traditions and practices. To start this topic off the children will be focussing on their own local area first exploring the environment and learning what makes Morville special. They will then learn where China is on our world map before moving on to discovering all about Shanghai. The children will end the half term by comparing Shanghai to their locality before identifying similarities and differences between human and physical features. As part of this topic the children will end their work with a Chinese New Year celebration in class where they can showcase their learning to families and friends of Morville

**In Birch Tree Class** the children will be turning their classroom into the deck of the unsinkable Titanic as our Year 2/3 class explore the ship's epic maiden voyage, the iceberg collision and the powerful legacy it left behind through creative lessons in History, English, Science and beyond. This work will link closely to the children's art and design work on paper sculpting where the children will be using techniques in how to transform 2D card shapes into three-dimensional structures and sculptures to create their own Titanic

Sculpture. These sculptures will then be displayed and shared as part the classes' Titanic Museum which will be visited by families and friends.

**In Chestnut Tree Class** the children will be carrying on with their topic of Horrid Henry and the Terrific Tudors. The children are looking forward to their trip to the Shrewsbury Museum where the children will follow in the footsteps of real characters from Tudor times from the poor to the wealthy including Tudor royalty. They will be completing a walking tour of the town and will have the exciting opportunity to explore a range of original and replica historical artefacts from the time period. The children will also get their own chance to build a flat pack Tudor home, try writing with quills and enjoy dressing up in clothes from the time period.

### **Clearing out the Clutter and finding Contentment**

I have a secret: I'm messy.

The trouble is, I actually don't like mess — but I'm not naturally tidy either. So, every now and then I choose a room, or a cupboard, and clear it out. I sort the clutter, organise what's left, and sometimes even add labels (for the benefit of everyone else in the house, of course).

A few weeks ago, it was the larder. I was amazed at what we've accumulated in just seven months!

But once it was done — once everything had a place — something changed. The important things were visible. Cooking felt less stressful. I even felt more inclined to bake. A small act of clearing out created space for something good.

I wonder how your Lent is going?

Perhaps you resolved to give something up and you've kept to it faithfully. Perhaps you made it to day two. Perhaps you decided to take something up — prayer, volunteering, generosity — and it hasn't quite taken root in the way you'd hoped.

If you're anything like me, it's very easy to turn Lent into a measure of our own spiritual success or failure. And when we fall short, the temptation is to feel disappointed in ourselves.

But I don't think Lent was ever meant to be about proving ourselves.

Yes, it is a season in which we draw closer to Christ in his suffering. St Paul, in his letter to the Philippians, speaks of wanting to know Christ — even in his sufferings. But that journey is not about self-loathing, it's about deeper trust, dependence and ultimately deeper contentment in Christ.

Over the past few years, I've begun to think of Lent less as “giving things up” and more as spiritual decluttering.

Just as clearing the larder makes space and helps me see what I actually need, Lent can be a time to notice what clutters our hearts. What distracts us? What weighs on us? What patterns, habits or anxieties make it harder to see God's presence clearly?

It isn't about relentless self-criticism. It's about making space.

Yes, I will slip up. We all will. That's why Jesus teaches us to pray, "forgive us our trespasses." But we do so held in the promise of Romans 8 — that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

So perhaps, for the rest of this Lent, the invitation is not to try harder, but to clear a little space. To set down what isn't needed. To focus on what matters.

And in that newly cleared space, to discover that Christ has been there all along.

### **Archdeacon's Letter**

The Venerable Derek Chedzey As I write this we are fast approaching the fourth anniversary of the full scale Russian invasion of Ukraine on February 22nd. I have learnt through listening to the Ukrainian community who came here following that invasion that for many this war actually began in 2014 when Russia invaded the Crimea. Our communities have offered hospitality, love and care to those displaced by this act of war.

Wherever we look our news is constantly full of conflict and around the world there are armed conflicts and tensions which cause us all to stop and ask is there not a better way to resolve our differences. Whatever the politics and reasons for the Russian invasion what is clear is that despite peace negotiations this war is continuing to see people killed and injured on both sides. It is important we do not lose sight of the fact that in war there are no winners only losers.

There are many theological arguments on whether warfare can ever be just and how we appropriately remember those lost in war. For us as Christians the Bible has a lot to teach us about the root causes of warfare and bloodshed. We are also reminded in those same pages that we are called to serve one another and to care for those who suffer. The ultimate sacrifice will always be to give our lives away for others.

"Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends."

John 15:13

As Christians we are called to build relationships that create peace and harmony and offer the reconciling power of Jesus' love. We are to offer a better more appropriate way to live and it is through the empowering of the Holy Spirit that we are changed. It is the Holy Spirit that builds the fruit of the Kingdom within each of us, and this enables us to bear one another's burdens and create communities of peace.

As Jesus prepared for his own death, he warns the disciples not to lose heart when they see strife in the world. As they stand outside the temple in Jerusalem, he warns them what is to happen in their lifetime. His words are fulfilled in 72AD when the Romans destroy the temple in Jerusalem, but they are also just as true today for us as for his disciples.

"Jesus answered: "Watch out that no one deceives you. For many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am the Messiah,' and will deceive many. You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains."

Matthew 24:4-8

Jesus does not mean that we have to accept war with its horror and bloodshed but that we should respond to it appropriately. The New Testament teaches us that human selfishness, greed and intolerance lead to conflict. The church has a message of hope and the solution to these driving passions deep within humanity. If we are in any doubt, it is Jesus and his sacrifice for us that reconciles us to God and helps us offer peace in the world. We are called to fight evil and stand up for

the Kingdom and its values; in doing so we help to build a better world. Our job is not to judge but to offer love and support. As a clergy person I have had the privilege of hearing the stories and experiences of grief and pain that war brings from those most impacted by it. I have always tried to bring God's love, forgiveness and compassion to those who are tormented by memories of war. As the church we are called to care for those who suffer and to build a more peaceful world. In this period of Lent perhaps we should all pray for peace and reconciliation wherever there is conflict
